# Municipal Property Tax Sale

This year the annual tax sale will be held at 10:00 a.m. on September 26<sup>th</sup> at the Village Office located at 91 1<sup>st</sup> St NW. A list of properties available for purchase at the tax sale will be advertised in the Arrow Lakes News on September 15<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> as required under the *Local Government Act*.

#### What is a tax sale?

A tax sale is a public auction of properties within a municipality which have unpaid property taxes from two years prior to the current year. At 10:00 am on the last Monday in September, the municipal collector must conduct an annual tax sale by offering for sale by public auction each parcel of real property on which taxes are delinquent. Delinquent taxes are any taxes remaining unpaid on December 31, two years after the year the tax was imposed. For example, taxes imposed in 2020 and still unpaid become delinquent on January 1, 2022.

### **Local Elections 2022**

Local government elections in British Columbia are held every four years. This includes elections for Mayors and Councillors. Village of Nakusp residents can vote for one (1) Mayor, and four (4) Councillors, for a four-year term on Saturday, October 15, 2022.

**ADVANCE VOTING** will be held as follows:

Wednesday, October 5, 2022 8:00 am to 8:00 pm Nakusp Sports Complex Auditorium 200 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue NW

There is no need to pre-register to vote as the registration of all electors for this election will take place at the time of voting. Resident

electors must produce **2 pieces of identification** (at least one with a signature).
Picture identification is not necessary. The identification must prove both residency and identity.

# The Community Wood Smoke Reduction Program

The primary goal of the program is to improve air quality and reduce health problems attributable to wood burning. The program provides a financial incentive for residents to replace old, inefficient woodstoves with new efficient, EPA-certified heating appliances. In partnership with RDCK, residents can receive \$300 to \$750 rebate on the purchase of a new stove or electric heat pump (\$200 to \$650 from the Province/Lung Association and \$100 from the Village). If there is any fire related activity, tell dispatch and they will contact the local fire department. Don't call the Fire Chief at home, call 9-1-1.

Fire and life safety inspections will resume in businesses and public buildings. This will include but is not limited to the following:

- Exit doors and pathways, signage and lights;
- Functional alarms, fire extinguishers, sprinkler systems;
- Detection devices and unobstructed sprinklers, Commercial Cooking Appliances; and,
- Common/obvious electrical and other fire hazards.
