# **Bylaw Enforcement Updates**

Bylaw Enforcement Policy C012 was adopted on November 25, 2024, at the regular Council meeting and is available on our new Bylaw Enforcement web page and our online document library. The newly published Bylaw Enforcement webpage includes an online complaint submission form. All complaints must be made in writing; forms are available in the office.

The Village operates its bylaw enforcement practices on a complaint-based approach. Compliance through education is the preferred method of enforcement; however, if necessary, tickets may be issued, and further bylaw enforcement efforts may be used to obtain compliance.

1st Street (from Nelson Ave to 6th Ave)
Broadway Street \*(from 6th Ave to 8th Ave)\*
8th Ave (from 1st Street to Broadway Street)

Priority 2: Waterfront walk

1st Ave SW, 2nd Ave SW, 3rd Ave SW, 4th Ave SW,

5th Ave SW.

Broadway Street (from Nelson Ave to 6th Ave) sidewalk snow removal is the responsibility of the adjacent property owner/occupier.

# **Parking Restrictions for Snow Clearing**

A friendly reminder that parking restrictions for snow clearing (when we get snow) are in effect from November 15 through to April 1st of each year. Vehicles parked in contravention of the Traffic Street and Sidewalk Bylaw No. 496 can be towed at the owner's expense. Please do not park or leave parked on Village Boulevards vehicles, trailers, or others. The Village is not responsible for the condition of anything left on the boulevard that gets damaged by snow clearing or other municipal activities.

### **Dangerous Trees and Blow-Down**

Many people in Nakusp work in and around trees while harvesting or processing them. Rules and regulations exist for working around trees, especially in the forest industry. Trees in parks, around trails, or other urban areas where people like to hang out have different rules for tree management than those set in the forest industry.

The main concern for both settings is that the trees will fall on someone or something valuable. In urban settings, there are more people, which changes the risk. When dangerous trees are assessed in municipal parks, they must be assessed by a certified danger tree assessor with training specific to parks and recreation. The difference comes from the Wildlife Tree Committee, which, along with the University of Northern BC, is responsible for training dangerous tree assessors in the province.

In 2024, the Village contracted a dangerous tree assessor to survey the park and trails both before and after the September windstorm. The trees removed were assessed by a professional and found to present a risk to people using those areas. After the windstorm, because of blown-down and hungup limbs, staff and contractors spent more than 20 days cleaning up over forty (40) trees.
